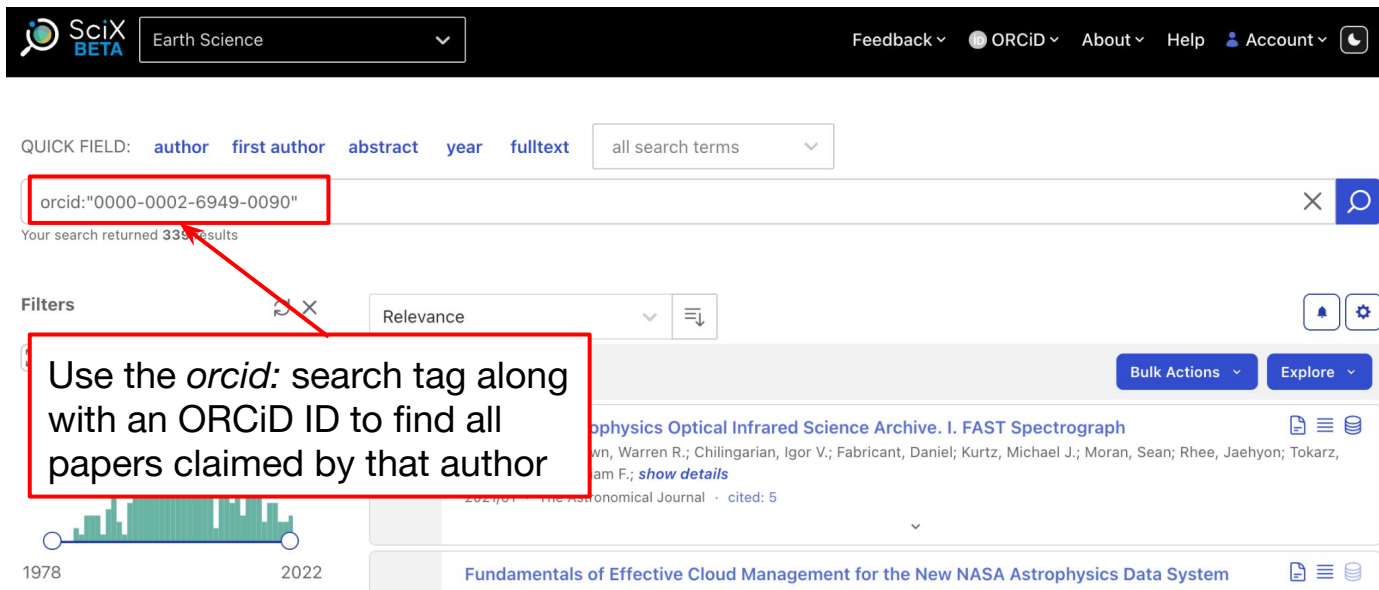
What is it?

Our ORCID* integration allows you to curate your personal bibliography and provides name disambiguation for SciX searches

What can I do with ORCID in SciX?

- **Claim your papers** using the SciX interface, which also adds them to your personal bibliography on orcid.org
- **Share your curated bibliography** with others, by providing them with your ORCID ID
- **Find others' bibliographies**, by searching for their ORCID ID in SciX

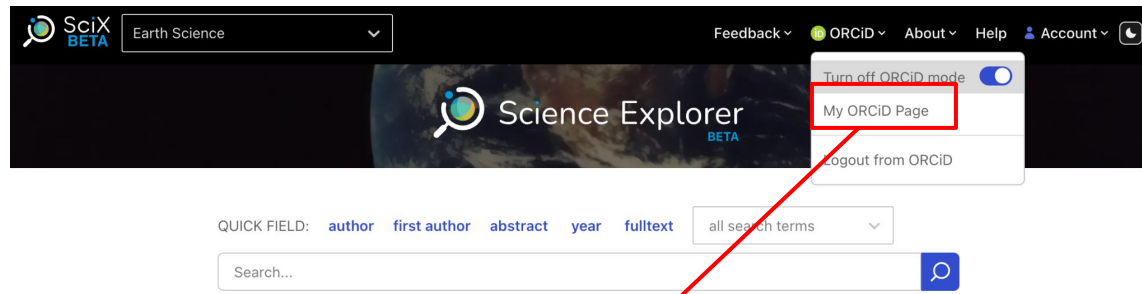
*What is ORCID?

ORCID is a not-for-profit organization that assigns 16-digit persistent digital identifiers (the ORCID ID) to researchers. It allows you to maintain a bibliography in a manner that distinguishes you from other researchers with a similar name.

Claiming papers with your ORCID ID in ADS

Step 1.

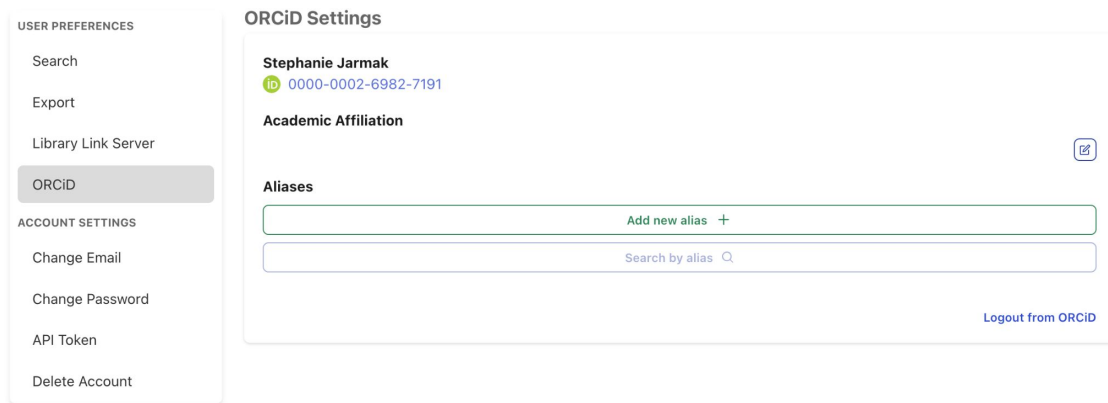
After creating an ORCID ID, sign into ORCID in SciX.



On the ORCID menu, click the Sign In link, then follow the prompts to sign into your ORCID account

Step 2.

Fill out your ORCID settings in SciX (you must be signed into your SciX account). Add any other names you've published under and give permission to SciX to access your ORCID profile.



Step 3.

Search for your name in SciX, then click the Claim in ORCID button on your papers. Approved claims will be searchable within 24 hours.
